The following items were discussed:

1. Resolution declaring Automated External Defibrillators owned by the City of Orange Beach as surplus and unneeded and authorizing the donation of said property to the Alabama Charter Fishing Association (ACFA).
2. Resolution authorizing execution of an agency agreement with JJPR, LLC, for public relations and marketing professional services.
3. Resolution authorizing execution of a professional services agreement with Heidi Lemon for theatrical performance dance instruction for "Guys and Dolls".
4. Resolution authorizing the purchase of a Vehicle for the Sportsplex through State Bid from Stivers Ford Lincoln, Inc., in the amount of \$49,116.

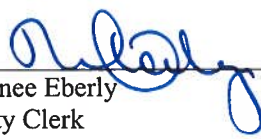
Public Comments:
